

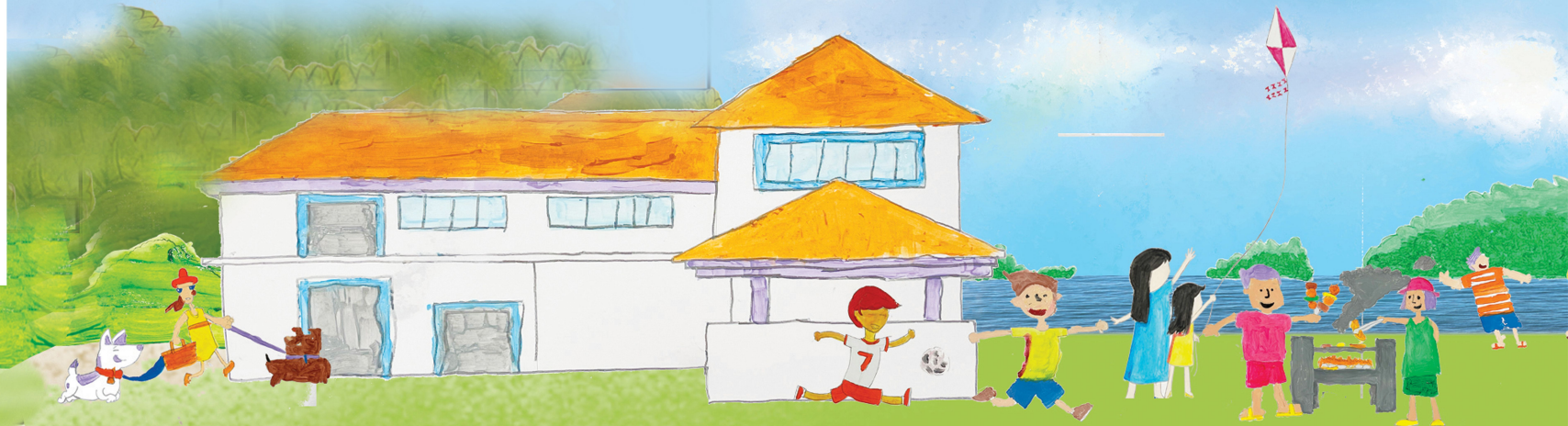


## CHANGI AIRPORT

Changi is a spectacular neighbourhood of Singapore, famous for its international airport. This quaint small town is adorned with a bustling hawker centre, a prison, a museum and chalets. Changi Airport MRT station is located in eastern Singapore and mainly serves commuters going to and from Changi International Airport. On 30 June 1981, it moved from Paya Lebar to its new premises in Changi for future expansion. Today, Changi Airport is renowned for its unrivalled passenger experiences, which have become synonymous with global connectivity, clockwork efficiency and unique, thoughtful services. Changi Airport has been recognised as one of the best airports in the world.

## CHANGI BEACH AND CHALETs

Changi offers families a peaceful and idyllic staycation option in chalets ranging from suites to villas. One example is Changi Cottage built in 1950. This holiday bungalow was used by senior members of the government from the 1960s to 1980s. Founding Prime Minister Lee Kuan Yew used it as an office after Singapore separated from Malaysia in 1965.





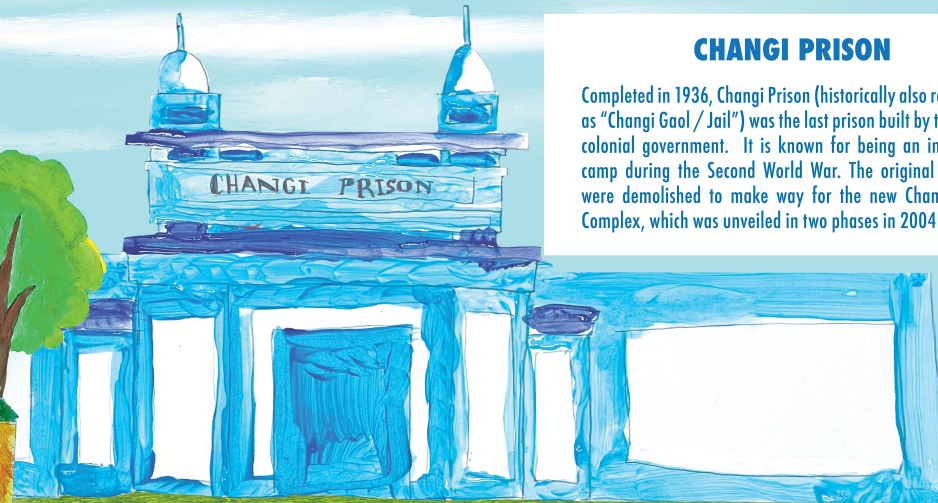
## CHANGI CHAPEL AND MUSEUM

Changi Chapel and Museum is one of the landmarks of the Changi area. It shed light on the tumultuous era and the events in Singapore from 1942 to 1945 during the Japanese Occupation. Opened on 15 February 2001—a date that coincides with the anniversary of Singapore's fall to the Imperial Japanese Army. The space pays respect to the prisoners of war (POW) and civilians interned at Changi prison camp during the Second World War.



## CHANGI PRISON

Completed in 1936, Changi Prison (historically also referred to as "Changi Gaol / Jail") was the last prison built by the British colonial government. It is known for being an internment camp during the Second World War. The original premises were demolished to make way for the new Changi Prison Complex, which was unveiled in two phases in 2004 and 2010.

### CHANGI VILLAGE HAWKER CENTRE

The popular Changi Village Hawker Centre is located nearby, where patrons throng for its famous local delicacies, including nasi lemak (Malay fragrant rice dish). Crowds gather to hang out and have their favourite evening food and drinks. The Hawker Culture in Singapore was successfully inscribed as Singapore's first element on the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity on 16 December 2020.
